what will my donation be used for?

Your donations will be used to keep the hostels running. They will support the costs of food, water and electricity for all of the children and staff. They will cover costs of wages, transport, school uniforms and materials, blankets and shoes, as well as building maintenance and renovation.

how much does it cost to sponsor a child?

The cost of providing a child with a secure, caring and loving environment, with access to good education and a healthy diet is £60 per child per month. We currently receive only 50% of this amount, around £30 per child per month. We are seeking new sponsors to join this vital work and donate the remaining £30 per child per month, or share a sponsorship with others.

how do I make a monthly donation?

There are a number of ways you can donate your monthly sponsorship:

1. Visit our website and click on the Sponsor A Child button.
2. Fill in the supplied form and set up a Standing Order.
3. Set up a monthly donation online with your Bank.
4. Send a monthly cheque to our office at the address below.

what is gift aid?

Gift Aid was established by the UK government to allow registered UK charities to claim tax back on any donations they receive from tax paying residents of the UK. This means that we can claim back around 28 pence for every £1 you donate, making your money go even further.

can I send the children letters?

Of course. We are more than happy to translate any letters or cards that you send. We simply ask that they be kept brief, no more than one or two sides of paper and that the language is simple and easy for the children to understand. We cannot promise that a letter will be sent to you in return, but we encourage the children to write replies, which we will translate for you. Also, why not send a photo or picture along with your letter?

can I send the children individual gifts?

Unfortunately not. We feel it can be unfair for some children to receive gifts and not others. However, each year at Christmas we give gifts to all of the children in our care and to all of the members of staff. If you wish, you may donate to this fund and your money will go towards the costs of buying these gifts.



facts and figures

In Thailand, trafficking is a £10 billion annual business, which is 50% to 60% of the government's annual budget and more lucrative than the drug trade.

The internal traffic of Thai females consists mostly of 12-16 year olds from hill tribes of the North and Northeast.

In 46% of all trafficking cases, the criminal traffickers know the victim.

In one kidnapping scheme in the central Thai provinces, an agent photographed village girls on their way to school; showed the photos to a brothel keeper who ordered the girls he wanted.

The agent returned and kidnapped the chosen girl.
